Listening Project #1

In addition to learning how to play your instrument, an important part of becoming a complete musician is listening to good players on your instrument. This helps develop your ears and your concept of sound, it shows you some of what's possible on your instrument, and hopefully it's fun and enjoyable for its own sake. You will need to pick two famous players on your instrument from the attached list, tell me something about them, and then go listen to some of their music and tell me about what they play and how they play it. The project requirements are as follows:

The paper should be 4-6 pages in length.

The paper must be typed and single spaced.

The font must be Times New Roman, Arial, Courier, Courier New, or Cambria, 12 point.

Spelling counts. Grammar counts. All sentences must be complete sentences; you must observe good paragraph structure with topic sentences...in short, you should write a coherent, intelligible research paper.

The rough draft is due Friday, June 6.

The final is due on your finals day-P6-Friday, June 13, P1/2-Monday, June 16, P4-Tuesday, June 17, P5-Wednesday, June 18

The first page:

The first page needs to have *your name*, *your period*, and the title of your report.

Label the first section "Biography #1". The biography section should be one page long, and it should include the name of the first person you're writing about, details about their life, facts about what music they made that was important, what they thought about music, and who they were influenced by and who they influenced. Essentially this is one page worth of detail to tell me (and you) why I should care about them.

The second and third pages:

The second and third pages are where you will type your thoughts on three different songs, recordings, or videos by the artist of your choice. I recommend three recordings from youtube, as those will be the easiest and cheapest to find, however CDs/itunes/spotify/etc. are acceptable. Please format each section as follows:

My Thoughts:

If you get the recording from youtube or spotify, please type the url (web address) for the source. If you get it off itunes or a CD, please put "itunes" or "CD", along with the album title.

"My Thoughts" must be at least one full paragraph long (4-6 sentences) and include the following:

What instruments are being played
What genre of music is it (your best guess)
Is the music saying anything? Is it telling a happy story, or a sad story, or is it angry, or about love, or...?
Do you like the music? Why or why not?

The fourth page:

The fourth page should be labeled "Biography #2". This should be the biography of your second artist, following the same format as page 1.

The fifth and sixth pages:

These pages are for your three recordings of your second artist, following the same format as pages 2 and 3.

The presentation:

On the day of your final you will give a short presentation (5 minutes or less) where you will pick one of your artists and one recording. You will need to give a brief summary of the artists' biography, play one recording for the class, and explain why you feel this recording is important.
